IPW examined 3 options in detail:

- · Single ice pad shared by all sports
- Twin pads
- · Arena style venue

They concluded that the second option of two separate pads was the most financially viable and they have provided a report with detail on design, utilisation, finance, and operations which we can use to attract developers and operators.

Our key priority is to firm up on on a location. IPW and the Project Team have looked at many possible sites this year and we are in on-going discussions with Clyde Gateway, City Property, Glasgow City Council and Scottish Enterpise.











DESIGN - FINANCE - BUILD - OPERATE

IPW has detailed building and plant designs ready which can be adjusted for the size and shape of the final site. Their designs meet Glasgow City Council's net zero carbon agenda to be a carbon neutral city by 2030.

IPW recommendations include establishing a suitably experienced Operator as a partner and a funding route which would allow us to take forward the business plan to the next stage.

Our search will include the public agencies that bring a potentially particularly attractive financial route.

- Developer builds rink with an operator guaranteed rent, which is used to repay loan
- Utilising access to public sector low cost of capital

This entertainment and sports funding model is the approach used for arenas and sports facilities throughout the UK.
