2022 SCOTTISH CURLING SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2022 Scottish Curling Senior Championships will be taking place from 17th to 20th February at the Lanarkshire Ice Rink in Hamilton. 12 men's teams – six each in Sections A and B respectively – and five women's teams will take to the ice and battle it out for the National Seniors' titles.

With no Scottish senior championships in 2021 due to the covid-19 pandemic, this year's edition of the event comes with great anticipation and eagerness to return to competitive curling. In accordance with Scottish Government guidelines, all players are strongly encouraged to do a Lateral Flow Test before playing and spectators are asked to please refrain from attending the event if they display any covid-19 symptoms.

In the men's competition defending champion Keith Prentice (Borders) returns with an unchanged line-up from the team that clinched the trophy in 2020. The squad will compete in the B Section, alongside fellow returnee Philip Wilson (Stranraer). Graeme Connal (Perth), Ken Horton (Edinburgh), Brian Heron (Greenacres) and Robbie Stevenson (Kinross) are new additions to the field.

Having lost out to Prentice in the 2020 final, John Duff (Forfar) will be out for revenge this time. He too heads to Lanarkshire with an unchanged rink and will contest in the A Section. Hugh Neilson (Hamilton) and Willie Paterson (-) are set up for successive appearances with unchanged formations as well while Team Hardie (Dumfries) will also return but feature a different line-up skipped by Alex Dickson. Peter Wilson (Stranraer) and Lockhart Steele (Hamilton) bring a change to the contesting teams.







On the women's side, 2020 champion Jackie Lockhart (Aberdeen) returns with an unchanged team. Having traded Scottish Seniors between herself and Susan Kesley's Edinburgh side since 2016, the two rinks will once again be the ones to watch in a diminished women's field. Only three other line-ups will take to the ice in unchanged returnees Kate Adams (Stranraer) and Liz Paul (Perth) while Gail Thomson has taken over as skip of the Ayr side formerly headed by Margaret Agnew.

The winning teams will earn a chance to represent Scotland at the World Curling Seniors Championships in Geneva, Switzerland in April this year.


